## Heisey's Amber

# Great Plains Heisey Club, November 2017, Eric Tankesley-Clarke

Heisey's amber can be divided into two broad categories. First is amber made for Fred Harvey Restaurants and not offered otherwise. This began as early as the 1920's, although some sources think possibly even as early as 1918. (Other sources give a date of 1902, but this was based on some incorrect assumptions.) The second category is amber made for Heisey's own catalogue. This was made around 1951-2. The price list calls it Sultana. Today, we use Sultana to mean the dark shades made in this late period; the pale shades made around the same time are called Honey Amber. In fact, Heisey amber, whether made for Harvey or sale to the public, comes in many shades and tones.

Fred Harvey orders used lead amber, at least part of the time. Much Harvey amber

does have a clear resonance when tapped that is lacking in Heisey's usual soda-lime production. Late formulas did not have lead, and some of the late Sultana production probably reflects this. Some Sultana and Honey Amber does not have the resonance. Some pieces of late Heisey amber are so rare that they may represent experimental pieces.

When Imperial bought the Heisey assets, they acquired a recipe for amber, but this is not necessarily a recipe used for any of Heisey's production. Furthermore, Imperial had Cambridge's amber formula, plus others of their own. Imperial may not have used Heisey's formula at all. Much Imperial amber does not have the same lustrous red glow of most Heisey amber.

#### Crystal and amber animals by Heisey and Imperial

The following tables are derived from *Heisey and Heisey by Imperial Glass Animals*, Hahn & Kikeli. There is always the chance there are other Heisey animals in Heisey Sultana or in Imperial amber, or that Imperial might have made other, unrecorded Heisey animals in crystal. There even could be attempts to remove marks from Imperial pieces to make them appear as unmarked Heisey. Whenever both companies made an animal in the same color, strong fluorescent UV will make the difference obvious, whether crystal or amber. Heisey crystal animals will glow yellow-green; Imperial's will glow milky white or not at all. Heisey Sultana animals glow with dull flame orange; Imperial's amber is muddier and glows a dull, murky blend.

#### Imperial Dark Blues & Heisey

Imperial made **cobalt** blue, but in #1506 Provincial, not in animals. Nothing that Heisey made in Stiegel Blue was also made by Imperial in cobalt. Heisey made four animals—the three colts and Oscar—in Stiegel blue. All are said to be marked <H>. The three colts were made by Imperial in **Ultra Blue** and were marked IG. Stiegel blue is very dark blue with a purplish cast. Ultra Blue is deep blue, not as dark, with no hint of purple. Side by side, the colors are quite distinct. Ultraviolet helps very little. Even if someone removed an Imperial mark from an Ultra Blue colt, there should be no confusion.
